Atheists, Humanists & Agnostics-UW Madison

The “Atheists, Humanists, & Agnostics” at UW-Madison was founded in 2005, however, the group began to flounder after several of the enthusiastic founding members graduated. Since 2009, I have begun the arduous (yet rewarding) task of rebuilding AHA back to its former glory.

No one wants to join a boring club. Atheist student groups that succeed are the ones which have a variety of engaging social, intellectual, volunteering, and other activities. Yet, in order to organize these events effectively, student organizations need a strong base of dedicated and passionate “officers.” In short, you need exciting events to attract new members, and you need a lot of excited members to organize new events! Two years ago, a few eager members stepped forward and with this small base of officers, we began to take on more activities and bigger events. In 2010 we were able to co-sponsor speaking events with Dan Barker, Ayaan Hirsi Ali, and Michael Shermer.

For student groups, by far the biggest opportunity for growth is the annual “Student Organization Fair.” Held early each fall, the Org Fair attracts thousands of freshmen interested in finding clubs to join. In 2012, the group will have a strong representation among the now sophomore class, and will have a new class of freshman to draw from. As you can imagine, this cycle will continue for four years until the original freshman have become seniors, and the club has had the opportunity to recruit members from four consecutive freshman classes.

AHA is still relatively early on within this growth model. We attended our first Org Fair in August of 2010, meaning that we still have 3 more cycles of growth to look forward to. Since 2009, our membership has tripled from a little over 100 to well over 400 members. As we recruit the next three classes of college freshman, I expect to see our ranks expand by at least 250 students every year for the next three years.

The future looks bright.

Humanist Union of Madison

The Humanist Union of Madison (“HUM”) is a wonderful, Madison-area resource: a showcase of current humanist thought and expression.

From a dozen to two dozen lively, articulate freethinkers gather just before noon on the first Sunday of each month at the Meeting House of the Prairie Unitarian Universalist Society (“Prairie”), hidden on a quiet, tree-lined residential street. HUM imposes no dues and its gatherings are always free and informal. They start with a potluck lunch, feature speakers ranging from nationally-recognized humanists to knowledgeable local residents, academic and otherwise, and conclude only after there’s been a chance to question the speaker and offer a wide range of candid observations and opinions.

Past speakers have included Lori Lipman Brown, Dan Barker and Annie Laurie Gaylor, Eugenie Scott, Ron Solomon, August Berkshire, Sean Faircloth, Professors Ronald Numbers and John Hawks (UW-Madison), and Fred Edwards, National Director of the United Coalition of Reason. Active participant Bob Park, a retired Wisconsin DNR air pollution engineer, presides, keeps the group up to speed on upcoming Madison events of interest to humanists, and records the programs for broadcast on a local low power radio station and for web posting.

HUM started as an informal discussion group and has remained relatively unstructured. It has co-sponsored or invited other groups’ participation in many events, including presenting speakers, viewing and discussing films, holding nonbelievers picnics, and (since 2005) sponsoring Madison’s annual HumanLight celebration.

Madison Skeptics During the late fall of 2008 and winter of 2009, there was a "great minds think alike" moment when Jennifer Bunner and I both

started online social networking groups called the Madison Skeptics. Jennifer and I were both inspired by the great awakening of skeptical thinking which had taken over the zeitgeist in the previous couple of years.

Jennifer, along with Jackson Crawford, started a Meetup group and started getting inquiries almost immediately. I chose to use Facebook and in those more innocent days, Facebook allowed me quite a bit of latitude in searching for Madison-area people who might have similar interests. I searched out people who identified themselves as atheist, freethinker, nonbeliever or agnostic in their religious views; people who listed as favorite authors the likes of Dawkins, Harris, Dennett, Sagan or Shermer; people who identified interests in science advocacy and activism in combating nonsense like creationism, intelligent design, anti-vaccinationism and 911 truthers. I compiled a list of a few hundred Facebook members and sent out a feeler message to see if anyone was interested in meeting to discuss our skeptical and scientific interests.

The response was overwhelmingly positive, and included a note from Jennifer letting me know that she was already well down the path I was attempting to blaze. We immediately joined forces and the Madison Skeptics was born of coffee-house meetings, social events, restaurant get-togethers and library lecture series. For that first year and a-half, we met frequently (as much as twice a month at first) but later on, monthly or even every other month. I made many new friends and was hugely encouraged by these meetings. There seemed to be a significant amount of pent-up desire to congregate and meet with like minded individuals. The skeptical movement in Madison and surrounding areas continues to percolate and evolve.

When the opportunity to join the local Coalition of Reason (CoR) arose, Madison Skeptics saw it as a natural way to connect with other like-minded groups and advance the cause of reason and rationality in our area. MadCoR, as it will evidently be known, will attempt to leverage publicity (billboards and other advertising avenues) to gain attention and support in our area for the cause of reason. Madison Skeptics are excited to be a part of this coalition.
