CFI–TB is a local branch of the premier worldwide Secular Humanist and Skeptics association based in Amherst (Buffalo), NY, founded by Paul Kurtz. Our all-volunteer branch promotes lectures in cooperation with other like-minded associations, has several area socials monthly, participates in civic events promoting our mission, and supports fact-based education for all ages, and especially politicians.

Our success in building the growth of Freethought and inter-association cooperation depends upon paid and active memberships. CFI Challenges Indiana's Religious Privilege in Solemnizing Marriages

The Center for Inquiry (CFI) filed a complaint in the United States District Court challenging an Indiana law that privileges religious institutions in the solemnizing of marriages. Indiana code 31-11-6-1 specifies that marriages in Indiana may be solemnized only by a small number of secular elected officials and a large number of clergy or other persons associated with religious organizations.

CFI, a national organization advocating on behalf of science and secular values, believes the law is unconstitutional on the grounds that it allows all manner of religious leaders to celebrate marriages, and allows persons of faith to be married by religious leaders of their choice, while denying these opportunities to persons who desire a nonreligious celebration by a Secular Celebrant. This represents a preference for religion over non-religion in violation of the Establishment Clause of the First Amendment, and denies rights secured by the Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution.

"I have had many couples contact me over the years who are not religious and are seeking someone to solemnize their marriage who represents their life stance," said Reba Boyd Wooden, Co-Director of the Secular Celebrant program for Center for Inquiry and Executive Director of Center for Inquiry-Indiana. "Some are religious but simply do not want a religious wedding. Some have family of different religions, and want a secular wedding to avoid conflicts. Indiana couples should have this option."

Center for Inquiry established a program to train Secular Celebrants in December 2009. Currently there are 23 Secular Celebrants who have been trained and certified by CFI. Eight are from Indiana and others hail from 10 other states and the District of Columbia. However, since Center for Inquiry is not a religious organization, these Secular Celebrants cannot solemnize marriages in Indiana or any place in the United States under this certification alone.

Nor is retirement the end of activity, but the beginning of putting your energy and efforts into the things that truly matter.


If you think that the basic philosophical outlook of Humanism can make a major contribution to human well being at all levels, it is time to join us as a volunteer to put your beliefs to work.

Polk County has relented. Local prosecutors decided after over a year of threats, to back down on all but one charge. His supposed crime was that he talked and walked around before the meeting of the Polk School board. FLORIDA REPORT Civil liberties news in the Sunshine State



Dear ACLU Supporters,

They are just relentless.

Corporations and government agencies are trying to use their influence to get carte-blanche access to our private data.

And if we let CISPA — the Cyber Intelligence Sharing and Protection Act — become law, that's exactly what they'll get — nearly complete access to everything we do online.

Urge your senators to vote NO on CISPA and any other legislation that would let the military collect our private internet records.

CISPA already passed the House. But if we don't take a stand in the Senate, **companies could soon have access to share our sensitive and private information with military agencies, including the National Security Agency.**

CISPA effectively allows them to gain access to our personal information without a warrant, without oversight, and without limits, and the Senate may soon vote on proposals that go just as far.

Those are rules we can't live by. We deserve better privacy laws. And we demand a better bill than CISPA.

We need to make our voices heard: Tell your senators that you <u>oppose any legislation that would allow the</u> <u>military to use personal information to spy on</u> <u>Americans.</u>

TBPCC is an autonomous adjunct to the Humanist Society. In February of 2012, council members presented **a course on Post Carbon issues** at the University of South Florida. We showed that there are likely to be dramatic changes in the way we live in the intermediate future.

If current trends continue . . .

- The population of the United States will increase to over 600 million by 2080, and in 2150 it will equal China's present size.
- World population will achieve 14 billion by the year 2075 and 30 billion by 2150.
- By 2030 China will be absorbing all available global oil exports, leaving none for the US or Europe.
- China's economy will surpass the size of the present global economy before 2050.
- In 2072, the federal debt will amount to \$896 trillion, or \$1,629,091 for each American (assuming a US population then of 550 million).
- Thanks to the doubling of US households living on less than \$2 per person per day between 1996 and 2011, in 150 years there will be about 1.5 billion Americans living on practically no income.
- The number of billionaires in the world (having grown from 793 to 1210 in just two years, from 2009 to 2011) will equal the world population in only 70 years. (Given the previous trend, this is especially gratifying news: since the **rate** of growth in the number of billionaires in the world exceeds the rate of growth in extreme poverty in the US, this means each American will become a billionaire *before* his or her grandchildren plunge into desperate poverty).

...**If** current trends continue! Will they? The points above are true, but an invitation to skepticism. Don't be manipulated by statistics, but do be aware of the significant problems to which they point.





NOW is a multi-issue political organization. NOW's self-defined role has been to initiate change for the benefit of the greatest number of people, to affect the legal and institutional structures of the society in a way that systematically expands the choices and possibilities available to all women. In this way, NOW takes action to bring women, as a class, into the mainstream of society, rather than offering aid to individual women in achieving personal solutions or temporary relief from oppression.

The Florida National Organization for Women (NOW) is in strong opposition to the Personhood Amendment ballot initiative for which the organization Personhood Florida is currently collecting signatures, according to Florida NOW president Donna Slutiak. "This amendment is ridiculous and an insult to women," Slutiak said. "The issue of Personhood would have very far reaching results, and would do more than criminalize abortion; it would also make birth control pills and the IUD illegal in the state of Florida. The amendment states that human life begins at the time when an egg is fertilized, which will also impact in-vitro-fertilization clinics. How would you like your mother's fertilized eggs that are sitting in a clinic freezer to have inheritance rights? Do you want to have to go underground to get your birth control pills?"

Florida NOW expects all intelligent people to pledge not to sign this initiative, and to vote against it, if by some fluke it does get on the ballot. Personhood is bad for womanhood. A Tradition of Advocacy

Remember Lilly Ledbetter? She was told on her first day of work at Goodyear to never discuss her salary with anyone. It wasn't until she found an anonymous note in her locker that Lilly realized that she was being paid as much as 40 percent less than her male colleagues in the same position. This is exactly why these pay secrecy policies that punish employees and help hide discrimination need to go!
